My Fellow Disciples of Christ,

May God our Father give you grace and peace!

This greeting is from the first chapter of St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians, which well suits our merger, *"We always pray for you, and we give thanks to God, . . . . For we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and your love for all of God's people,"* (3,4). As a church St. Andrew has been praying specifically for Holy Family for over a year and a half.- As prayer is a great way to begin our unification!

Now, we officially begin this merger between our two churches, with the goal being, the same as St. Paul's was; to send the "*Good News*" out, to move many to conversion in Christ, and to bear good fruit in our lives. As well, there are a lot of "*things*," that have accumulated over the years that need to find new homes. To attract parishioners, the parish needs to be attractive. Some hard decisions loom before us, and we must act, and act now, or the situation itself will begin to make the decisions for us.

But, we do have a secret weapon in my fellow priest: Fr. Thomas Tran. Fr. Thomas is living at the Holy Family rectory and is going to have a lot of responsibility in how Holy Family Church operates. He is super capable and did a wonderful job leading St. John Bosco in Lakewood, turning around a parish that was in a similar straits. As well, St. Andrew parishioners are asking me what they can do to help.

Finally, for the Catholic Church to flourish, we have to have success in encouraging youth to serve the church as priests or religious. I'm seeking to do this through prayer, adoration and a devotion to Sunday Eucharist; the source and summit of our lives. If we implore Jesus to help us, he promises that, *"whatever you ask in prayer, you will receive,"* (Matt. 21:22). We've got a lot of work to do, but if St. Paul could pray, work and evangelize for Christ at the same time- so can we.

More attractive and sound, spiritually, aesthetically and financially. These are my goals for Holy Family.
